Using an adaptation of Linda S. Davies' Pom Pom Dahlia pattern, participants will practice the Self-Closing Mock Ring to create a layered blossom. When all the parts are created, each layer will be adhered to netting or tulle for a solid effect. Later, using basic techniques of the florist industry, participants will assemble the finished flower. The focus of this session is to help tatters practice the self-closing mock ring, learn to adapt a pattern and introduce assembly techniques that can apply to a variety of 3-

dimensional projects.

Skills Required: Sound knowledge of rings and chains. Knowing how to create self-closing mock rings is highly recommended and understanding how to create projects using 2 shuttles is necessary.


