

2023 TEACHER APPLICATION PACKET

We are seeking talented tatters to teach at our 25th Annual Tatting Workshop & Retreat to be held at the Ross Point Camp and Conference Center on April 27 – April 29, 2023.

Our theme for the workshop will be "Here There Be Tatted Treasures!" with the theme contest centered around "Tatted Treasures/Pirates". This theme is all about having fun and letting our imaginations run wild. Let's see where it takes us.

We are looking for classes that offer:
new and creative ideas for projects
a variety of techniques
suitability for all skill levels.

Original and new patterns are preferred, but not required. Patterns copyrighted by others are allowed with written permission from the copyright holder. Note: Class projects do not need to be theme related.

Classes:

Our schedule allows us to offer up to 3 classes per day, one 2-hour class in the morning and two 90-minute classes in the afternoon (or a single 3-hour class in the afternoon split into 2 90-minute sessions).

Class size will be limited to a maximum of 15 students.

Classes must be designated as either a project or technique class and by skill level as follows:

Class Type:

Project Class – the emphasis will be on teaching the pattern and not technique(s);

Technique Class – the emphasis is on teaching the technique(s) needed to complete the pattern used.

Skill Levels:

Adv. Beginner - knows the basics - rings, chains, picots, joins and reading patterns.

Intermediate - knows and is comfortable with the above, plus two shuttles, split rings/chains, beads

Advanced - knows and is comfortable with all of the above and is ready for more.

Teacher Requirements:

We are seeking 6 full time and 2 part time teachers.

Teacher applicant must:

- indicate if they wish to teach full time, part time or either
- be willing to accommodate up to 15 students per class
- submit the required number of class proposals
- submit a completed 2023 teacher application packet with all requirements met

Full time teachers:

- will teach 5 classes (8 or 8.5 hours total) and have one free class period¹
- will submit a minimum of 6 complete class proposals of varying skill levels
- at least two proposals must be for a 2-hour class

Part time teachers:

- will teach 3 classes (5 hours total) split between the two days¹
- will submit a minimum of 4 complete class proposals of varying skill levels
- at least two proposals must be for a 2-hour class

Either full or part time:

- will teach either 5 (full time) or 3 (part time) classes depending on classes chosen¹
- will submit a minimum of 6 complete class proposals of varying skill levels
- at least two proposals must be for a 2-hour class

Successful applicant agrees:

- their class curriculum will fill the allotted time period.
- to provide a copy of any homework required for the class at time of notification of acceptance (November 6-2023)
- to provide a separate and completed class model for display for the duration of the workshop
- to provide a copy of their original pattern and class handouts to the Shuttlebirds Librarian for inclusion in the Shuttlebirds Tatting Guild library
- to arrive at Ross Point on Thursday afternoon and depart on Sunday. Contact the workshop coordinator if you need other arrangements.
- to notify the workshop coordinator immediately if you will be unable to attend or teach your classes.

¹ A 3-hour class counts for 2 classes in total count

Teacher Compensation:

Workshop registration fee will be waived.

Full time teachers will be paid \$425.00 and be provided room and board (double/triple, est. value \$260), to include 3 nights lodging and 8 meals.

Part time teachers will be paid \$250.00 and be provided 50% room and board (double/triple, est. value \$130) for 3 nights lodging and 8 meals.

Teachers wishing a single room will be responsible for the difference in the room rate.

Vending: up to one half of a table will be provided if requested. Teachers will be responsible for collecting the Idaho sales tax for all sales transacted in the vending room.

Shuttlebirds will provide:

- ❖ Copies of class handouts, (1 per registered student per class plus one extra). Masters must be received on or before March 15, 2023, as a PDF or Word document.
- ❖ Registration updates to teachers, approx. every 2-3 weeks after registration opens, with student count, and contact information if requested.
- ❖ Transportation to/from the Spokane airport, if requested. Arrival in morning to mid-afternoon, and/or departure in late morning or later is best. Other arrangements can be made if necessary. Flight itinerary must be provided **at least 30 days in advance** of the workshop, so Shuttlebirds can make arrangements. All other travel expenses will be the responsibility of the teacher.

Applications will be accepted through noon (PST), Saturday, October 1st, 2022.

Timeline:

Application packets will be available on our website in June. www.shuttlebirds.com

Notification of accepted applications will be made on or about Sunday, November 6, 2022.

The class pictures and teacher names will be posted to our website, blog, and Facebook page & group on or before November 30, 2022.

Registration will open by January 1, 2023.
